RIBA Military intelligence exhibition for Blitz tunnels

As part of its plans to bring the Kingsway Exchange Tunnels to the public, **London Tunnels will collaborate with the Museum of Military Intelligence** to showcase original artefacts, equipment, weapons and documents.

The exhibition will feature stories from the Battle of Britain and D-Day, the espionage operations of the Cold War, the Falklands War, peace-keeping missions and the terrorist threat of the 21st Century.

General Sir Jim Hockenhill KBE ADC Gen, Commander of Strategic Command and Colonel Commandant of the Intelligence Corps, said it would be **"the world's most authoritative permanent exhibition of military intelligence"**.

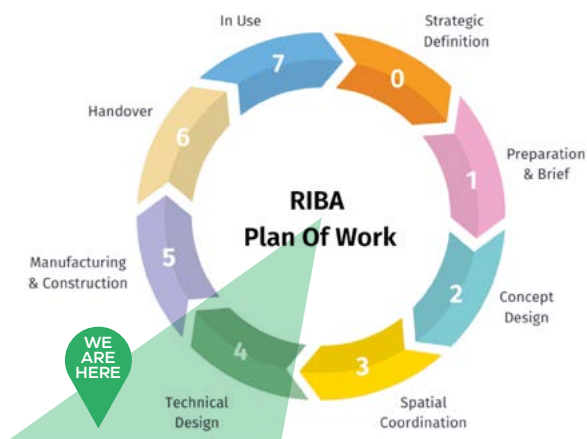
The trustees of the Museum of Military Intelligence said the **"historically significant and evocative location"** would bring the exhibition to life.

RIBA stages

The **Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA)** Plan of Work is a structured process used in architecture and construction to guide a project from idea to long-term use.



Stage 0 // Strategic Definition

Decide if the project should happen and define the overall need.

Stage 1 // Preparation and Brief

Develop the project brief, budget, and feasibility.

Stage 2 // Concept Design

Create the initial design concept and main ideas for the building.

Stage 3 // Spatial Coordination

Coordinate the design with engineers and consultants and develop layouts.

Stage 4 // Technical Design

Produce detailed drawings and specifications for construction.

Stage 5 // Manufacturing and Construction

The building is constructed on site.

Stage 6 // Handover

Building is completed and given to the client.

Stage 7 // Use

Building is occupied, maintained, and evaluated.

Company updates

RIBA Design Progress // The London Tunnels project has successfully progressed through RIBA Stages 0, 1, 2, and 3, and has now commenced RIBA Stage 4 (Technical Design). This marks a key transition from design development into detailed technical coordination and engineering, ensuring the scheme is fully defined prior to construction.

40 Farnival Street Acquisition // The acquisition of the building at 40 Farnival Street, intended to significantly enhance and expand the primary entrance experience, is currently ongoing. Completion of this purchase is subject to the successful close of the current capital raise, which remains in progress.

Vertical Transport & Safety Infrastructure // Plans for the installation of large-scale lift infrastructure to facilitate efficient vertical movement of visitors, alongside associated health and safety systems, are being developed for phased delivery. A proof-of-concept implementation is targeted for Q4 2026, followed by full-scale completion by H1 2028.
